❖ There can never be a sentence without a verb.

1. Throw the ball to me.
2. Gopal wrote a beautiful poem.
3. The carpenter is making a table.
4. Anil kicked the ball.
5. The peon rings the bell.

❖ There are three tenses. (Different forms are):

1. Present tense – is, are, am
2. Past tense – was, were
3. Future tense – will be, shall be

Examples:

- i) I am (Present)
- ii) I was (Past)
- iii) I will be (Future)
 - (a) I run (Present)
 - (b) I ran (Past)
 - (c) I will run (Future)
